


Your Radical Homestead

A Tool for Making your Homestead Dreams Happen



Whether you are dreaming about a future homestead, or working hard to make your current homestead thrive, it can be hard to take time to celebrate successes in the midst of our busy lives.

Your Radical Homestead is a tool for stretching our ideas about homesteading, articulating a vision for your Radical Homestead, celebrating what you've accomplished this year, and moving you forward into your wildest dream future.

Before you begin: Create time and space to really dig into this exciting work. Get out your favorite journal or write on the pages themselves. Allow yourself to sink into the process, but don't worry too much about the product: It's perfectly okay to make a mess, draw pictures, arrows, or mark up the page with your exclamation points!!! Be as creative, or as linear as you'd like. It's your chance to put your homesteading dreams into words.

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First off, I want to define and embrace the word *RADICAL*. So often we think of radical as being extreme, but I prefer these definitions:

rad i ·cal

adjective \ˈrɑ-di-kəl\

: very new and different from what is traditional or ordinary

: very basic and important

Because these definitions are so inclusive, it's easy to claim the word radical for our very own. Let's celebrate the radical within us!

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Next, let's talk about your homestead. Many people hear the word "Homestead" and automatically conjure up an image of 40 acres of pasture and forest with a farm pond, lots of animals, fruit trees, and huge gardens.

Here's the reality: Homesteads are rural, urban, and suburban. They are as small as a container garden on the balcony, or on large acreages. Homesteaders devote themselves to their craft full-time, part-time, or even very part-time.

Homesteading is both a state of mind, and a practice.

- It is creating networks of interdependence with friends, neighbors, and within your community, and balancing this with self-sufficiency and self-reliance.
- It is cultivating a hard-work ethic and a can-do attitude.
- It is taking a hard look at your current situation: employment, food sourcing, diet, finances, health, and coming up with creative ways to live more in harmony with the earth, and to your highest potential.
- It is dynamic, always urging you, the homesteader, to learn and grow, and to put new skills into practice.
- It is fun and challenging, satisfying and frustrating, routine and infinitely creative.
